FINAL CURTAIN?

When Essex County AA ended an Indoor Race Walking Championship, owing to declining lack of entries over the years, it appeared to signal an end. We had no Race Walking Representative in the Committee Room to put our case for giving it another go, nor one to drum up entries. We still haven't. But to our rescue came Hertfordshire County's Hon Race Walking Secretary, enthusiastic Dave Annetts, who after consulting with Hon Race Walking Secretaries of other 2 County teams in a Tri-Counties Indoor Meeting at Lee Valley, agreed to admit Essex entrants in order to "save" our County Championship. Although a busy administrator, your Essex County Chairman Andy Catton took on a task of representing our County's race walkers in order to get a deal done in your interests. Many emails were sent to one-and-all to try and keep this race walking Championship going. It wasn't a long journey, as it was at the same Lee Valley venue where our Essex & Eastern Counties Championship was held (a meeting at which walking had been dropped). Former Essex County AA President Peter Cassidy offered his services to judge at the Tri-Counties Indoor meeting. Essex Walkers were clearly told, "use it or lose it". You'll see Andy Catton's comments below. We must all thank Colin Harle and Melanie Peddle for flying our Essex flag - one in each category.

Writes Essex County AA Chairman Andy Catton:

"I suspect the County will consider it is not something to continue with next year: But I gather Mark Easton has a "cunning plan" to revitalise race walking in the South of England. When entries closed for this event, very disappointingly there were just 2 Essex entrants (Mel Peddle and Colin Harle)."

A VERY HAPPY BIRTHDAY

On St George's Day, 23 April 2024, Centurion 576 **George Eastwood**, a member of Woodford Green AC (as then called) is to celebrate his **100th** birthday. He qualified as a Centurion reaching 100 miles in 20:39.29 on route to covering 115 miles 1705 yards in his Club's 1976 race at Ashtons Track, when leading the hosts to a team victory. He'll become The Centurions' 2nd centenarian after another Essex race walker - Leigh-on-Sea based ex-Ford Dagenham worker and 1908 Olympian Bill Brown (Polytechnic Harriers) Centurion No 12 - who'd qualified in 20:38.01 in a 1907 London-to-Brighton & Back event. - Notification from Bill Sutherland: Roy Stratton, who was a great official for Middlesex County AAA
 plus I can remember his name on the Race Walking Scene at Enfield, passed away recently.
- Writes Martin Oliver. Roy Stratton When Ponders End AC amalgamated with Enfield AC in 1965 to form Enfield Harriers, Enfield AC had, of course, a strong squad of race walkers Ponders End AC had none! So, several of the leading lights from Ponders End AC were persuaded to 'have a go' at Race Walking Roy was very much the star of the show with limited training, he finished the Enfield Open 7 in 1966 in 60.47, and was clearly a 'natural'. Our coach, Stan Mantor tried everything to get him to take up Race Walking but to no avail. Roy enjoyed his running and of course got heavily involved with the official side of Enfield Harriers, being Secretary among other things, so he wasn't really interested. I hope that helps to fill in the details. This is all done from memory, so there might be slight differences. Glad to see you're still going strong. Sadly I can't say the same!
- Adds Hon Ed: A former race walker, yes, but also a "one hit wonder". Enfield's Roy and Beryl Stratton were among many who turned up for that great Enfield 90th Open 7 Reunion in 2016 let's face it, who wasn't there? Remember that wonderful picture, taken by Brian Boggenpoel, with 28 Centurions in shot (2 had to leave straight after the race) and our host Club's showing of former stars and stalwarts. As for that 1966 Enfield Open 7 it was a time when top walkers raced most weekends the first 3 were all Olympians-to-be: John Webb, Brian Eley and Shaun Lightman who clocked 51.06, 22 and 55 respectively. Two more future Olympians were high on the result sheet: Arthur Jones (7th) and Peter Marlow (13th). In the handicap race, 2 of our current readers took home 1st and 3rd prizes Bob Dobson and Brian Keegan respectively. Enfield had the last finisher A King 146th in 77.11. One wonders how his race walking progressed? Trowbridge AC were the top team, followed by SWC and Southend. Trowbridge also won the Handicap team, followed by London Vidarians and Essex Beagles. Brian Eley, Brian Keegan and Bob Dobson were in their respective scoring fours, so adding handicap team prizes. Host's Enfield held their annual 7 Miles' Championship in conjunction: 1 Ken Easlea, 2 Amos Seddon, 3 Charlie Fogg. We extend our condolence to Beryl and all other family members.

Bob himself had been a Legion Standard bearer and had served as Hon Treasurer at his Legion's nearby East Dulwich Branch. An Order-of-Service was a collector's item - all 8 pages of it! This contained a front cover photo of Bob (see right) as many knew him - at the bar with a cigarette on the go. Inside was a full-page action shot of Bob in long distance action and another picture of him alongside Centurion 983 Hazel Fairhurst (Lancs WC) in a classic Roubaix 28



Hours race (see page 7). Music chosen for The Committal was "The Long-and-Winding Road" (Beatles) and Chapel exit music was "That's All" (Stacey Kent). The back page saw smartly dressed Bob with Royal British Legion colleagues outside his East Dulwich branch, where a post-service gathering was held. Also printed was a full-page account of Bob's life and highlights, which included earning an England Representative blazer as a long distance walker. A half-mast Union Flag flew outside the Legion. This venue had, in past times, been used as a Centurions' Committee meeting venue. Bob's good send off ended with an open bar all afternoon and a buffet feast. With so many racewalkers, past and present, now retired, it's more convenient to be available for funerals of our former colleagues and rival competitors alike.

RACE WALKING IN SOUTHERN ENGLAND

With reference to the long term aims and objectives, presented to the London Regional Council, as mentioned racewalking is at an all-time low in the UK. The situation, targets and proposals aforementioned is what was called "a think tank" 14 years ago when serious efforts were made to promote the sport and achieve Olympic representation. The efforts by some paid dividend to allow the sport to be more recognised. However, generally all the endeavours (with missions, strategies and heartbreak) were made by athletes who had family lives, full time jobs and attempting to train twice a day seven days a week. Only a small minority had the privilege to train full time with no other commitments. Expertise is available in our sport. However, this has been badly overlooked for many years by our race walking fraternity for whatever reasons, whether coaching certificates, health and safety issues etc. My memory goes back to Essex schools visited in 2010 when Paul Nihill and Olly Flynn took their medals to the schools and assisted in the presentation of race walking. This period and later saw the full development of the King brothers who achieved Olympic qualification on limited resources, no funding or the like. Their amazing endeavours can be replicated again, providing correct guidance and motivation are provided. Regional Ambassadors such as Chris Maddocks and Ron

Wallwork I am sure would carry a torch to lighten up the sport again. I am still passionate about our gladiator sport of race walking. We need to be more united in our mission and embrace the expert knowledge available to promote racewalking for it flourish again. Respectively submitted.


