

With four fixtures remaining only Jacqueline Benson needing to compete in 2 of them, Simon Morgan 3 and Lesley Hall and Chris Hobbs in all 4, have the opportunity to become new Leaguers this year.

If there was a 'Leading Leaguer of the Summer' award it would surely go to Callum Wilkinson who in the space of two weeks won his first British senior title and collected a bronze medal at the European u23 championships. His early season form; a sub 82 performance at the European Cup, a 10km international win in a new GB best time of 39.21, an u23 cbp of 40.29 at Bedford, indicated that something special was on the way.

In winning the British Grand Prix 20km staged in Leeds, which incorporated the national championship in a time of 81.46 Callum ended a six year domination of the event by his friend Tom Bosworth.

At the Euro u23 in Sweden things didn't quite go to plan; he wasn't technically at his best and two red cards just before the half way point demanded a cautious second half to his race. Nevertheless, his time of 82.13 underlines his consistency in recording quick times and should be the platform for even faster ones that will be required in Doha at the World championships and next year in Tokyo.

There was a dramatic finish to the race in Sweden as Salih Korkmaz who was over a minute ahead with 2km to go suffered a bout of sickness and was forced to slow down allowing neutral Russian Vasily



Mizinov to overtake him just metres from the finish line. The picture was taken just before 3km with Callum tracking the long-time race leader Salih Korkmaz (Turkey) 81.32 and eventual winner Vasily Mizinov(ANA) in 4th position 81.29.

Organiser David Hoben writes: Veterans AC hosted the seventh running of the Jack Fitzgerald walks at Tilgate Park on 22nd June, on a lakeside course once used as the test bed for Britain's water speed record around popular beauty spot called Campbell's lake, in what can only be described as perfect June weather. The race was held to raise funds for Blind Veterans UK, as a tribute to RAF fighter pilot Jack Fitzgerald. On the start line ages ranged from 9 year old Charlie Perry (Lewes AC), to prolific veteran record breaker Arthur Thomson (Enfield AC) who recently turned 83.

The first three in the men's headline race over 10.325m race were Trevor Jones (Stey/L) 59.52, Jim Ball (Stey) 60.33, Mark Culshaw (Bel/L) 65.58, whilst Emily Ghose (Ton) 61.26, triumphed after a close battle with Penelope Cummings (AFD/L) 61.28 to be first lady home. Among the two dozen competitors were Leaguers Melanie Peddle (Ltn/L) 63.27, Dan Maskell (SWC/L) 69.47, Steve Cartwright (CTen/L) 73.14, David Hoben (SWC/L) 65.43, Geraldine Legon (Bxy/L) 77.47 and Arthur Thomson (EHAC/L) 78.27

The entry of nine (only 2 of them women) for the **EA under 20/23 10km championships** at Bedford on 22nd June was sparse to say the least, but that shouldn't detract from excellent performances of Callum Wilkinson (EHAC/L) 40.29 who set a pb which was also a Championship best performance, the 42.28 by Cameron Corbishley (Med) 42.28 and Chris Snook's (AFD) 45.00. The pit lane was in use by three athletes, one of them being George Wilkinson (EHAC/L) 50.37.

The Surrey WC 'Gazette' 4 miles cup was held in conjunction with the Blackheath & Bromley meeting on 3rd July and the winner was David Hoben 47.30 ahead of Michael Harran 48.35 and Chris Flint 53.19. (all SWC/L).

Lots of action involving Leaguers on Saturday 6th July. At Lewes in the local club's development races, the 5km was won by Penelope Cummings (AFD/L) in 28.38 and also competing were Mark Culshaw (Bel/L) 31.26 and Dave Hoben (SWC/L) 36.35.

Moving up the country, at Coventry the **BMAF inter-area match** was taking place over 2km and where six Leaguers was scoring points for their various teams. They were Melanie Peddle (Ltn/L) 11.06, Malcolm Martin (SWC/L) 11.18, Steve Allen (Bnt/L) 11.34, Rachel Lawless (Ilf/L) 12.21, John Borgars (Ltn/L) 13.37, Geraldine Legon (Bxy/L) 14.20.

Further north at Macclesfield in the LWC 'Barnard 10km fixture Dan Maskell (SWC/L) 66.10 finished 3rd behind Adrian Edwards (LWC) 58.38.

There were two races in London on Tuesday 9th July. The second Woodford 3km had an excellent turnout of 20 walkers. Luc Legon (Bxy) 12.56 won easily. Matthew Crane (Bxy) 13.46 and Dave Annetts (NHRR) 13.49 occupied the minor places, whilst Maddy Shott (Bel) 14.09, Melanie Peddle (Ltn/L) 16.44 and Emma Dyos (Ilf/L) 17.01 were the top three ladies. Other Leaguers racing were Fransisco Reis (SWEC/L) 15.13, Stuart Bennett (Ilf/L) 17.54, Steve Allen (Bnt/L) 18.13, Rachel Lawless (Ilf/L) 18.57, John Borgars (Ltn/L) 20.33, Lesley Morris (Ilf/L) 20.40 and Geraldine Legon (Bxy/L) 21.28

Meanwhile, over at Battersea Park the third VAC fixture of the season was the 5km championships and was staged good conditions. The overall winner was Stefano Zennaro 26.42. The championship winner was Penelope Cummings (AFD/L) 28.14, followed home by Maureen Noel (Bel/L) 32.04. The Men's championship winner was Dan Maskell (SWC/L) 32.22 and behind him performances by Tom Casserley (EHAC/L) 34.18, David Hoben (SWC/L) 34.55, Paul King (Bel/L) 35.03, Shaun Lightman (SWC/L) 37.12.

BMAF 20km held in conjunction with the Midland championships at Coventry on 14th July attracted 19 walkers of which 10 were women. In hot humid conditions Lisa Kehler (WB) was the first to cross the line in 1.54.19; the first man was Peter Boszko (Bfld) 2.05.55. Three Leaguers were in action; Noel Blatchford (Ab/L) 1st W70 in 2.27.07, Melanie Peddle (Ltn/L) 2nd W50 in 2.09.02 and Steve Allen (Bnt/L) who unfortunately was one of the seven athletes who collected three red cards. A further four walkers failed to finish.

On the same day at Ashford the Senior Eight Counties meeting, the 3km walk was won by Dominic King (Col) 12.02. Trevor Jones (Stey/L) 16.22, Emma Dyos (Ilf/L) 16.50 and Rachel Lawless (Ilf/L) 18.56 also competed.

The third week in July is **Njmegan Marches** time and walkers with ERWL connection spotted at this year's gathering were Sue Clements, Kathy Crilley, Chris Flint and David Hoben .

Penelope Cummings (AFD/L) 45.57 won her second successive **VAC race** at Battersea Park on 6th August, this time over 5 miles. Only five of the seven starters finished; Belgrave trio Mark Culshaw 47.44, Stefano Zennaro 48.40, and Paul King 59.26 who were separated by David Hoben (SWC/L) 57.30.

Over the weekend of 10th/11th August at Birmingham, the **BMAF** staged its T&F championships which include a 3 and 5km walk. A mixed field of 21 and 18 respectively contested the two distances in very blustery conditions. ERWL connections won age category medals. They were gold for M60 Steve Allen (Bnt/L) 17.55/30.27, W55 Rachel Lawless (Ilf/L) 18.56 and W65 Sue Barnett (EMAV/L) 33.24, silver for W40 Penelope Cummings (AFD/L) 16.33 and W55 Lesley Morris (Ilf/L) 20.46 along with a bronze for W40 Emma Dyos (Ilf/L) 16.52

The third **Woodford Tuesday 3km** on 13th August was won by George Wilkinson (EHAC/L) in a pb of 13.01. Dave Annetts (NHRR) 13.49 was second and Maddy Shott (Bel) 14.35 third. Fransisco Reis (SWC/L) 14.52, Steve Uttley (Ilf/L) 16.52, Steve Allen (Bnt/L) 17.49, Rachel Lawless (Ilf/L) 19.04, Geraldine Legon (Bex/L) 20.42 and Lesley Morris (Ilf/L) 20.51 were among the 13 starters.

Retirements from racing announced recently include two Ilford AC stalwarts; Dave Ainsworth and Mick Barnbrook. Both are Centurions and have been avid supporters of the League, Dave (on the right in the picture) taking part in the inaugural season.
