2019 International Postal Competition Results



Many thanks once again to Honourary Leaguer Dave Talcott (USA) for organising this competition and bringing so many "ordinary athletes" together in this way,

The competition includes results submitted of hour races worldwide in a calendar year and last year (2019) embraced 31 clubs and 113 athletes who represented 16 teams and once again ERWL connections did exceptionally well.

In the overall classification ERWL had Four athletes in the top dozen; George Wilkinson 1st, Dave Annetts 3rd, Jonathan Hobbs 7th and Francisco Reis 11th who all won their respective age group. Other individual gold medallists were: Jacqueline Benson and Silvana Alves who occupied 5th and 8th in the ladies overall result.

There were also individual category place medals for another seven Leaguers; Malcolm Martin, Helen Middleton, Peter Cassidy who collected silver medals, whilst Dan McKerlich, Melanie Peddle, Millie Morris and Chris Flint received the bronze awards.

The Masters team competition was won by Shore AC, USA, but Surrey WC (Reis, Martin, Dave Hoben) repeated its runner-up success of 2018 and Ilford AC (Steve Uttley, Stu Bennett, Simon Morgan) took the bronze medals on this occasion.

It is good to see that a number of Leaguers are participating in the NCRW Virtual Race Series which I'm sure gives some focus for continuing to train. Once again a decent field made for some close competition and despite being blown all over the course, in only her second race Catherine Davies shaved half a minute off her pb.

The chase for the team title is well underway with only 79pts separating the leading three clubs; EHAC 607, Belgrave team H 584, Surrey WC 528 and Ashford AC still within striking distance a little further back. Aldershot Farnham & District fielded five walkers among them two novices who showed promise and qualified for their '5 in the hour' badges.

On February 8th in the LWC Shoebottom Trophy 10km Tony Bell (LWC/L) finished 5th of the 13 starters in 66.31. The race winner was the promoting club's President Tony Taylor in 54.42. Andea Lennon (LWC) 82.23 won the handicap.

Leaguers have been scoring successes abroad again. Cath Duhig (CAMT/L) won the **Spanish Masters W20km** staged on 16th February in 2.08.50 which is her best time for a number of years. Meanwhile in Amsterdam Dave Annetts (NHRR/L) finished runner-up again in a **De LAT Winterserie 10km**. His time over two minutes slower than the previous Winterserie race was as a result of Storm Dennis and ten days off training because of flu.

On the same day as the second ERWL race, conditions were even fiercer on the Isle of Man where the **Murray Lambden Open** walks were taking place. Fifty-five walkers took part among them in the women's 20km was Aldershot F & D's Penelope Cummings who finished third in 2.04.54 behind Natalie Myers (2DASH) 1.53.02 and Niamh O'Connor (Cellbridge).

Two meetings, one outdoor and one indoor were on the fixtures list for Sunday 2nd March; At the University of Warwick campus the **Molly Barnet 10km / EA championships** and at LVAC a **Master's Inter-Counties match**. There was good turnout at both meetings and several Leaguers put in good performances

I was at the former to witness Tom Bosworth (Ton) post, which if ratified will be a national road best of 39.10. With storm Jorje expected conditions were better than anticipated; dry, but a strong gusting wind on parts of the circuit. There were titles for Millie Morris (Ash/L) 28.15 in the Women's u20 5km and George Wilkinson (EHAC/L) 46.47 pb the u20 title, whilst Jacqueline Benson with 60.21 collected a bronze medal in the u23's race. Melanie Peddle (Ltn/L) 61.18 occupied 3rd senior place, Dave Annetts (NHRR/L) 49.33 4th place and Steve Allen (Bnt/L) 60.28 5th.

In the Molly Barnet races Francisco Reis (SWC/L) 52.18 was first and current League leader Silvana Alves (Bnt) on debut at 10km was well under the hour with 57.00 for runner up spot. The picture taken at the finish doesn't show Millie who had raced earlier

At Lee Valley the distance was 2km and Malcolm Martin set an M65 CBP of 11.00.85. The other Leaguers competing were, Mark Culshaw 11.37, Helen Middleton W55 12.05, Rachel Lawless W55 12.15, Noel Blatchford M70 13.24, Chris Flint M70 14.27, Angela Martin W55 14.47, and Arthur Thomson M75 15.10.83

Only three Leaguers were in action at LVAC on 8th March in the **BMAF Indoor 3km championship**; Rachel Lawless W55 18.47, Noel Blatchford W70 20.06 who were category winners and unfortunately Dave Annetts M55 fell foul of the judges. The quickest walkers on the day were Carolyn Derbyshire W40 16.07 and Ian Richards M70 16.01.

In the **Kent Indoor 1km** championship at LVAC on 14th March Geraldine Legon (Bex/L) clocked W60 6.59.
