Cecil W.Hyde, joined Enfield H to take up cross country running in 1927 and after just a couple of races it was evident that it wasn't the event for him, and just as quickly when he tried race walking it was obvious that that discipline was. In his first season he broke into the headlines beating several top walkers of the day to win the big Empire Cancer Campaign North of the Thames 20 miles qualifying race around Regents Park in 3.01.01.

Favourite for the RWA 'Junior' 10 miles in 1928, in consequence of his numerous Open wins, Hyde by now was familiarly known in the world of walking as 'Sticker'. However, not fully recovered from an attack of flu he was beaten into sixth place. The picture was taken at the

Once over the flu, he never looked back. Within a fortnight he gained a convincing win in the Middlesex 10 miles championships, the first of his five county road successes – leading his club-mates to gain their first team awards.

County titles and Open victories over the following three years were capped by three AAA 7 miles titles – 1928, 29, 30 and the AAA 2 miles in 1930 with a then championship best of 13.56.4. The AAA 2 miles was held at Stamford Bridge on the Friday evening followed by the 7 miles on the Saturday morning, and it was undoubtedly a tremendous feat to win both titles against strong opposition within a matter of 16 hours.

Stiker's record time of 52.21 achieved in the 1931 Club's Open 7 miles was perhaps one of his best performances and stood for nearly 30 years, seeing off the likes of, A.A.Cooper, J.F.Johnson, T.W.Green and H.G.Churcher.

When the RWA Senior 20 miles was allocated to Enfield in 1931, he generously provided 1,000 programmes gratis and with some excellent organisation by the local Committee, all were sold with the exception of a small number rationed for officials, etc. thus materially assisting towards the record profit resulting from this promotion.

Sensation! Or Seemingly So at the Essex and Eastern Indoor championships at LVAC on Saturday 12th February. There were only four competitors in the 1 mile walk and **all were disqualified** according to the result sent through to the announcer who didn't bother to announce it.

Unbeknown to the walkers, they hung around patiently for the result to be made or posted on the results board. An early report that all four had been disqualified was ignored as a 'tongue in cheek' joke. However, after another hour, another enquiry produced the documentation showing the 4 dq's.

No red paddles had been waived by Chief Judge Peter Cassidy, which only left infringements spotted by the track judges, as the likely reason for the dq's and four in one race? Very unlikely.

The Saturday prior to the *Martin Oliver 5* the **EA Winter 10km championship** was held in atrocious weather conditions; strong winds and persistent driving rain, at the Leeds University track. Current League leaders Abigail Jennings (u23) 51.46.20 and George Wilkinson (u23) along with Millie Morris (u20) 54.52.90 and Dave Annetts 54.47.90 were other Leaguers in the race. Abigail and Millie won their respective age group titles and George was 3rd in his. Race winner Chris Snook's (u23) 43.27.60 in the conditions deserves special mention and bodes well for the coming months.

In action again at the **British Indoor championships** at Birmingham on 27th February and setting new pb's were Abigail 4th/14.24.72 and Millie 7th/16.01.46. Not far behind also with a pb in 9th/15.73.72 was Jacqueline Benson.
