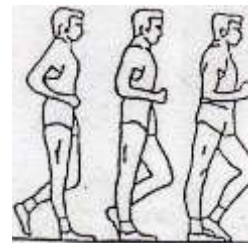

Cecil Gittins Memorial Walks Report by David Hoben

Cyclopark, Gravesend, 14 April 2018 - Veterans AC 2.5k/5k/10k/15k road race inc Enfield League

Veterans AC were pleased to host the third running of this event on a dedicated cycle circuit which in shape and gradients can only be described as a large Scalextric set. In all there were 42 entries, and 39 on the line, a little down on 2017, with ages ranging from 11 to 85.

We were also pleased to welcome Pauline Nihill, wife of Olympic silver medallist Paul Nihill MBE and Noel Carmody, current RWA president.

A loud round of applause was given by the walkers in the traditional Enfield League way to commemorate the life of Bernie Hercock, president of Enfield & Haringey AC, who had sadly passed away since the Donkey Lane meeting.

Given that the winter was prolonged and there had been a gap in the race calendar the times were respectable; the favourable and sunny weather this time took some by surprise!

The 15k was won in 85:24 by an in form Seb Parris (Ilford AC), with runner up Malcolm Martin (SWC) in 85:38 and coming in third for his first attempt at this distance was Ollie Hopkins (Lewes AC) with a creditable 88:22. For the ladies' 15k only entry was Angela Martin (SWC) who put in a gritty performance having had layoffs with injury in previous year finishing in 114.06.

For the 10k headline race which was to score in the Enfield League 2018 series this was not unsurprisingly won by Portuguese international Francisco Reis (TVH) in 50.45, the runner up was David Crane (SWC) in 52.34, and a third place for Seb Parris (Ilford AC) in 56.57 who went on to complete the 15k. The ladies race was won by 2017 overall League winner Helen Middleton in 61.29, second place was the ever-improving Melanie Peddle in 63.00, and a pb for Jacqueline Benson (Ashford AC) as she climbed to 65.11.

The supporting races included Abi Smith (BBHAC) who won her 2.5k race and is continuing her form. VAC are grateful to the ERWL for allowing this race to be incorporated in the Enfield League series.

Six *Leaguers* took part in the **English Masters inter-area** match at LVAC on 4th March; Fastest on the day was Malcom Martin (Surrey WC/L) 10.39, Melanie Peddle (Loughton AC/L) 11.16, John Ralph (EHAC/L) 12.19, Geraldine Legon (Bexley/L) 14.48, Fiona Bishop (Woking/L) 13.48 and Peter Hannell (Surrey WC/L)

Seven of the 17 walkers contesting the **BMAF 3km Indoor championships** staged at LVAC on 11th March had *Leaguer* status and all but one won their age category. Listed in time order they were: Fransisco Reis M55 13.53, Malcom Martin M60 16.14, Helen Middleton W55 17.35, Arthur Thomson M80 20.37, Fiona Bishop W55 r-up 20.55, Angela Martin 21.29 and Ken Livermore M85 25.54.

Chris Snook (Aldershot FD) won the **Molly Barnet/English 10km** championship at Coventry on 11th March. Six of the 16 competitors which included Chris Flint (Surrey WC/L) and Sean Pender (EHAC/L) fell foul of the judges.

The indoor **Herts, Kent and Middlesex 1km** was held at LVAC on 17th March. The winner was Luc Legon 4.01(Cambridge H). His mother Geraldine Bexley/L) 6.56 and Sean Pender (LVAC/L) 6.58 were among the 12 starters

Leaguers at the European Indoor championships

At the European Masters 19th/24th March staged in Madrid, *Leaguers* were also performing with distinction. Fransisco Reis with two silver medals, double fourth spots for Helen Middleton (the 5km by just 7 seconds), top five finishes for Malcolm Martin and Cath Duhig and solid walks from Fiona Bishop and David Kates paved the way for team silver and bronze medals in the 5km.

Leaguer David Hoben guested in **Lancashire WC's 10 miles** at Macclesfield on 4th April which attracted eleven starters. The race was won by the promoting club's Adrian Edwards in 96.53 and David clocked 118.20.

There were also eleven starters in the **VAC 5 miles walk**, which took place in good conditions at Battersea Park on Tuesday evening 17th April. All but two in the field were *Leaguers* and even they are active in the current series, so the full result is printed here. Seb Parris (Ilford AC/L) 43.26, Melanie Peddle (Loughton AC/L) 49.59, Steve Allen (Barnet/L) 51.09, Maureen Noel (Belgrave H/L) 52.42. Shaun Lightman, Chris Flint (both Surrey WC/L) 54.44 and 56.22, Paul King (Belgrave H/L) 57.09, Tom Casserley (EHAC) 58.21, David Hoben and Peter Hannell (both Surrey WC/L) 59.05 and 59.09

Unfortunately, the evening was marred when a cyclist collided with Kathy Crilley (who was scheduled to run in the London Marathon five days later) resulting in two fractured ribs and neck injuries and she spent at least one night hospitalised. I'm sure that everyone with rcae walking connections will wish her a speedy recovery.

Great Commonwealth Games for UK Walkers

Detailed coverage of the Games' walks which took place on 8th April was available on TV, has been covered in detail by *Athletics Weekly* and will no doubt in due course by *Race Walking Record*. So, my synopsis is a really a salute to all the GB walkers, (but particularly the only *Leaguer* in the race, Callum Wilkinson) who represented their countries with distinction at the 22nd edition of the Games.

In torrid conditions the performances by all the competitors; 15 in the men's 20km which started at 7am and the 13 women whose race got underway at 9.15am, were admirable. In spite of the early start temperatures rose quickly and there is no doubt that the women with the later start had the worst of it.

A huge enthusiastic mostly Australian crowd supported the event. Many weren't race walking fans, but with local resident Dane Bird-Smith favourite they turned up in their thousands, creating a tremendous atmosphere, to which all the walkers responded and they most likely provided the edge that that men's winner Dane Bird Smith

79.34 needed to surge ahead of Tom Bosworth 79.38 in the last couple of hundred metres. In third place was Kenyan Samuel Gathimba 79.51. The youngest competitor at 21 was Callum Wilkinson 82.35, who finished 7th only 18 seconds off his pb.

The women's race was equally exciting with Aussie's Jemima Montag and Claire Tallent locked in a battle for the gold. However, three red cards eliminated Tallent with 2km to go and her rival sped home in 92.50 ahead of NZ's Alana Barber 94.18 and Wales's Bethan Davies, who had walked brilliantly for a well-deserved bronze medal. The other UK walkers were; for England Gemma Bridge 5th in 39.31, Wales's Heather Lewis 7th in 101.45 and IoM's Erika Kelly 107.29.

All six walkers competed with distinction.

I had the good fortune to attend the event and had a long chat with Bob Gardner(left) who won the silver medal in the Edinburgh Games of 1970, behind the winner fellow Australian Noel Freeman and ahead of Bill Sutherland. The tropical conditions and pancake flat course of Currumbin beach starkly contrasted with the cold wind and driving rain out along the coast road through Portobello to Mussleborough and back in 1970. Bob, now 82 still competes and as the photograph shows, he remains in good shape. He asked me to pass on his best wishes to Bill and the British walkers that he got to know at the Tokyo Olympics of 1964.

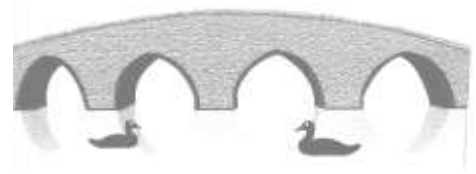
