

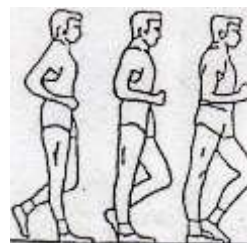

World Best for Enfield in 1977

In 1977, as a fund raiser for the £5000 needed to stage the Lugano Trophy Finals that were to be held at Milton Keynes later that year, an attack on the 100 miles Relay world best of 14.23.45 set by the Colorado Track club in 1973 was organised.

Chelmsford was the venue and it took place over the weekend of 30th April/1st May and consisted of ten walkers covering one mile each in rotation.

The Enfield team included GB internationals Charlie Fogg, Amos Seddon, Adrian James and ultra-distance star Peter Worth (pictured above in that order) and Scottish internationals Hamish Stewart and Graham Scott. The other team members were Geoff Robinson, Tim Major, Dave Salter and Colin Fisher.



They sliced over an hour and three quarters off the Americans' time clocking 12.37.24 and the *Race Walking Record* reported their average mile times as: Adrian James 7.05, Amos Seddon 7.06, Geoff Robinson 7.20, Colin Fisher 7.27, Hamish Stewart 7.28, Charlie Fogg and Graham Scott 7.31, Dave Salter 7.51, Tim Major and Peter Worth 8.09.

Five other clubs took part; Sheffield UWC 12.52.14, Belgrave H 12.53. 02, Brighton & Hove AC 13.01.48, Ilford AC 13.14.52 and Dawlish & S.Devon AC 14.46.33 and all bettered the Colorado club's figures.

Walkers still about today who took part (with their average times) were: Carl Lawton 7.07, Dave Ainsworth, 9.11 and Ed Shillabeer 7.29.

Cecil Gittins Memorial Walks

Cyclo-Park, Gravesend

Dave Hoben reports: Veterans AC were pleased to host the second running of this event on a dedicated cycle circuit which in shape and gradients can only be described as a large Scalextric set. We were also pleased to welcome for the second year running Olympic silver medallist Paul Nihill MBE and his wife Pauline attending as special guests. In all there were 50 entries, and 47 on the line.

The weather was favourable, just the right combination of sun and wind, the 15k was won in 75.10 by a very in form Luc Legon from Cambridge Harriers who has followed up his London Walks victory with this one, 10 minutes faster than the previous year record set by Malcolm Martin, and 14 minutes ahead of Seb Parris from Ilford in a creditable second place.

For the 10k headline race which was to score in the Enfield League 2017 series this was not unsurprisingly also won by Luc Legon in 49.13 which would have been a personal best had he stopped there. The runner up was Jonathan Hobbs from Ashford AC, with a 4 minute personal best, and a third place fast finishing Marshall Smith also from Ashford with a similar personal best.

For the ladies 10k this was convincingly won by Emily Ghose from Tonbridge AC in 56.53 also in a personal best and who managed to beat nearly all of the men.

In the 5k race George Wilkinson had a victory in 28.50 his second time under 28 minutes in two weeks and not far in front of first place Isabelle Bridge from Blackheath Harriers coming in at 29.22 with a more modest personal best. First female in the juniors 2.5k race was Abi Smith from Blackheath Harriers finishing in 15.21 in her first attempt at this distance.

Result's & Leaguer's Round-up

Lewes AC Track 5km walk on 17th February was won by Luc Legon 24.34 – David Crane 25.16, Malcolm Martin 27.57, Angela Martin 33.33, Michael Harran 34.07, Peter Hannell 34.25, David Hoben 36.35 and David Delaney 36.53. 11 took part.

Lancashire Walking **Club Allison Trophy 15km** staged at Chorley on 25th February won by Scotia member Bill McFadden in 1.23.04 – 4th was Dan Maskell 1.39.19 and on 8th April in the LWC Macclesfield Shield 20km race he finished runner up in 2.19.42 behind 2015 Nat 50km champion Adrain Edwards 2.00.10.

Cold and squally conditions were not conducive for quick times at this year's **Molly Barnet** meeting at Warwick University on 5th March. Nevertheless, there were some good performances. In the men's 10km Tom Bosworth 40.20 was untroubled in winning the race which incorporated the EA championships. Callum Wilkinson followed him home just a second inside 40 minutes and third registering a huge pb was Cameron Corbishley in 41.26. Backing Callum up and taking the team runners-up award was John Ralph 15th 63.43 and Arthur Thomson 19th 66.05.

In the ladies 5km, current *League* leaders Helen Middleton 30.31 and Melanie Peddle 30.39 occupied second and third behind the great Lisa Kehler 27.17. The ladies 10km race in my view produced the best racing of the day. Bethan Davies won in 46.07, but the battle for the minor placing couldn't have been closer and credit to all four of the women who finished within 10 seconds of each other; Gemma Bridge 47.07, Elisa Neuvonen (Finland) 47.09, Tatyana Gabellone (Italy) 47.10 and Heather Lewis 47.17.

In spite of the weather the turn-out was very good with walkers in all categories from under 11 upwards.

Dream Debut for Wilkinson

The eagerly anticipated 20km debut by the junior world champion Callum Wilkinson was well worth the wait.

In the annual **Albisetti Memorial walks** in the picturesque setting of Lugano, Switzerland, on Sunday 19th March, just five days after celebrating his 20th birthday, he finished a very creditable 8th in the men's international 20km event.

His time was a world class 1hr 23 minutes and 47 seconds! In his first race at the distance he bettered the qualifying times for 2017 GB selections for the European Cup for Walking, the European u23 championships and the World championships (being staged in London in August), as well as the England team for the Commonwealth Games in Australia in April 2018.



Wilkinson's time was easily a national u23 record and elevated him to eighth on the British All-time list. A feature of the performance was the consistency of his pace, reeling off the kilometres in 4.10/12 and 10km splits of 41.51 and 41.55.

Callum wasn't the only Wilkinson in action at Lugano, his fourteen year old brother George (*pictured*) made an impression in the u16's 5km where he recorded a time of 28.34, a three minute improvement on his previous best.

Six women were among the 17 starters who lined up for **the BMAF indoor championships** at LVAC on Sunday 12th March and for Helen Middleton W60 17.34 and John Borgars M70 20.08 it was their second outing of the weekend. Other Leaguers taking part were, in time order; Fransisco Reis M55 14.53, Malcolm Martin M60 15.52, Melanie Peddle W45 17.43, Cath Duhig W60 18.39, Ron Penfold M75 19.13 and Angela Martin W50 19.57. All but Angela won their age category.

The venue and course for this year's *Centurions qualifying 100 miles event at **Bury St.Edmunds** over the weekend of 5th/6th August, was tried out with races over 4, 6 and 8 miles on Saturday 8th April. The pleasant, virtually traffic free circuit with an excellent road surface is a certified 2 miles with excellent road surfaces.

Internationals Dan King and Callum Wilkinson were among the starters and in a class of their own, the former winning the 8 miles event in 59.00, and Wilkinson the 6 miles in 43.00. The leading ladies were Melanie Peddle 1.22.50 and Helen Middleton 1.00.42. Under 17 George Wilkinson clocked 39.25 for four miles.
