The ladies winner and second overall was ever present Maureen Noel (Belgrave & Leaguer) 32.16 in her usual impressive time. The men's winner was Steve Bishop (Vets AC) 30.10 and leaguers in the race besides Maureen were Dave Hoben 37.39. Centurion Chris Flint 37.51 and Peter Hannell 39.53.

John Northcott MBE RIP

The 1959 Enfield Open 7 winner John Northcott passed away recently. He was 87. John was a loyal member of Highgate H and I came into contact with him on several occasions. The first was the AAA 7 miles track championship at Hurlingham in 1959 and it wasn't a happy one, not that any fault for that was John's. More or less from the gun we battled stride for stride and with 271/2 of the 28 laps completed I was ruled out and it was a long journey back to Lancashire that evening

Over the ensuing year's John travelled with the national teams to all the big international gatherings, sometimes as an official, but often as a supporter and he was indeed Team manager for Phil Embleton. Ray Middleton and myself at the East German May Day meeting in 1971.

I found John supportive and generous and at Kingston in 1966 he presented Don Thompson, Ray Middleton, myself and the Judges headed by the legendary Wally Batson, with an embroidered tie.

John with his wife Freda (who played cricket for Middlesex Ladies in times gone by) visited Moulton last Autumn and we enjoyed three hours of nostalgic reminiscing.

More about the 1971 East German May-Day Walks

On a course considered to be short by some 370m. Phil finished a brilliant third in 84.05 behind Peter Frenkel 82.48 and Hans Reiman 83.05, whilst I was off the back in 9th with 88.20. In the 50km Ray was as solid as ever with 4.16.36 in 12th. Race winner was Christophe Hohne in 3.47.07.

A year later Frenkel and Reiman won 20km Olympic gold and bronze medals at the Munich Games. Hohne was the reigning 50km Olympic champion having won in Mexico by over 10 minutes, a remarkable performance given the way most sea-level athletes struggled with altitude issues.

It is sad that a cloud of suspicion hangs over the validity of many of the performances set in the Iron Curtain era..
