#### Surrey takes top honours for the first time!

Surrey Walking Club ended the promoting club's six season grip on the Enfield Race Walking League and weren't that far of snatching third place from Ilford AC who are the only other team besides the EHAC to hold the League title since its inception in 1997. Surrey's first appearance in the top three was as long ago as 2007 and their only other, perhaps serving notice of what was to come, was third team last year.

Forty-eight clubs were represented during the series and the surprises were undoubtedly the demise of Hillingdon AC, runner-up for the previous two years and the late season finish of Loughton AC, spearheaded by John Borgars and Melanie Peddle.

Fifty-one women took part in the series and the ladies champion Jo Miles, raced 10 times (the best 9 performances count) and reaped the rewards of doing so to improve on her 2015 third place. Last year's winner Maureen Noel paid the price for not racing at least one more than the seven she did. For Angela Martin, this was her third top three finishes in four years.

John Ralph and Dan Maskell moved up from second and third last year to winner and runner-up and Sean Pender who won the title back in 1998 was third, not that far ahead of fellow Centurion John Borgars. All four had a 'full house' of performances. The Junior League trophy was easily retained by George Wilkinson.

#### Results Round-up

**Surrey Walking Club's club championship and open 7 miles** held on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> October at Sandilands, was won by David Crane in 59.36 ahead of Graham Chapman 71.22, Arthur Thomson 76.56 and Anne Jones, the quickest lady in 77.33. Sean Pender 8<sup>th</sup> in 79.12 was the only other club member in the race. Fourteen walkers took part and they were; Paul King 77.36, Micky Harran 78.01, Angela and Malcolm Martin both 78.32, Geraldine Legon 80.39, Dave Hoben 81.19, David Delaney 82.48, Dan Maskell 86.10 and Russell Vroobel 86.19.

Three Leaguers were among the eight British walkers who competed at the **World Masters Championships** in Perth, Australia, competing at three distances between 26<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> October. I understand that Maureen Noel and Fiona Bishop also collected team medals in the marathon.

The other British walkers at the event were Norbert Will who won two 1sts and a  $2^{nd}$ , Ed Shillabeer who collected place medals in all three events, Ian Richards in two events and Peter Boszko in one.

Arthur Thomson 66.37 and Sean Pender 71.26 were the only EHAC walkers in action at the **Steyning Open 10km** held over the scenic but testing Sussex course on 19<sup>th</sup> November. Fransisco Reis 53.33 made competent return to racing after a lengthy absence through injury and along with Jim Ball, who was only 19 seconds behind decimated the 17 strong-field which included Dan Maskell 66.07, Anne Jones (2<sup>nd</sup> lady) 66.46, Micky Harran 68.35, Angela Martin 70.25 and Dave Hoben 71.18.

At the Lancashire WC 'Bill Jackson' 5km held at Simister, Manchester on 3<sup>rd</sup> December only 36 seconds covered the first six finishers. Dan Maskell was 4<sup>th</sup> in 31.40 and the race winner was Greg Smith who clocked 31.13.

Surrey WC's **Christmas Cup 5km** held at Tonbridge track on 3<sup>rd</sup> December saw an excellent turnout of 29 and featured Rio 20km sixth placer Tom Bosworth, who won easily in 22.04 from Chris Snook 22.39 and Jonathan Hobbs 23.58. The club had no representatives. Walkers with strong League connections who took part were; David Crane 24.18, Fransisco Reis 25.23, Malcolm Martin 28.17, Ron Penfold 32.04, Chris Flint 33.11, Angela Martin 33.50, Dave Delaney 34.24 and Dave Hoben 35.05.

Ron Penfold reports that conditions were good and that there was some excellent racing in the **Alf Palmer Memorial track meeting** at Horsham on 10<sup>th</sup> December.

Once again the races where very well supported and unusually, nearly as many ladies (19) as men (20) took part. The girls 1 and 2kms which started together was a very tight affair in the early stages with Abigail Smith, Davina Nova, Katy Stringer and Charlotte Wallis all close together. Abigail 6.02 emerged to win the shorter distance and Davina 12.11 the 2km. Jack Childs 17.19 again won the 3km although in a slightly slower time on this occasion. The ladies and men's 5km was also hotly contested; Luc Legon 22.28 knocking nearly 2 mins off of his last years winning time, from Chris Snook 23.43 and Jonathan Hobbs 24.09, whilst Emily Ghose 27.42 got the better of Lucy Lewis-Ward 28.33 and Abigail Jennings 28.37.

In both the men's and ladies races there were close races between walkers all the way down the field among them Arthur Thomson 31.57 and Leaguers Fransisco Reis 25.02, Malcolm Martin 28.42, Dan Maskell 32.40, Anne Jones 32.29, Chris Flint 33.09 and Angela Martin 33.13

It was very pleasing to see a lot of youngsters (16 of the 39 u20) putting in very good performances.

#### Club Records

It was very nice for me to receive most of the accolades for the recent 90<sup>th</sup> Open and Re-union and I have elsewhere expressed my thanks to Bernie Hercock and others about their vital roles in putting it on. However, we tend to forget that it was Martin Oliver (whose family's involvements with Enfield walking stretches back a long way), who initiated the Enfield Race Walking League in 1997 and thus the continuance of the Open Seven.

Athletes' Deaths At November's RWA Southern Area meeting, Chairman Noel Carmody drew attention to sad deaths of Aldershot, Farnham & District athletes who had been struck down while on a warm-up run outside their stadium. Stacey Burrows (16) & Lucy Pygott (17) were on a pedestrian crossing when hit by a speeding car. Lucy had represented Great Britain in July's European Athletics Youth Championships at Tblisi, winning an U/18 3,000m bronze medal. All readers will be deeply saddened. A 24 year old serving soldier has been arrested. Safety on roads is to be discussed at January's RWA Southern Area Committee meeting, as walking races do take place on public roads, and some walkers train on highways.
