

# $2018 ERWL - 1^{st}$ Fixture - at QEII Playing Fields, Enfield

The 21<sup>st</sup> ERWL season got underway on 20<sup>th</sup> January in dismal conditions. Dave Annetts won comfortably from David Crane and international Masters champion Ian Richards.

Newcomer Maddy Shott (pictured) made a most promising debut with sub 45 minute performance to lead the ladies home and looks to have the potential to go far in the race walking discipline. Another newcomer to the

League, Ashford's 17 year old Jacqueline Benson also showed great promise easily qualifying for her 5 in the hour badge.

Ilford AC (pictured) with eleven walkers in action including five novices, two of which which broke the hour, look set to make a serious challenge to regain the League title that they last held in 2008.

The next Fixture is on 17<sup>th</sup> February at QE11 Playing Fields, Donkey Lane, Enfield, EN1 3PL, **starting at 11.45am.** The main race 5 miles supporting races 1, 2, 3 and 4 miles.

#### RUSSELL VROOBEL RIP

Russell passed away on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> January and Ken Bobbett sent in this tribute to him.

"It was with great sadness that I learned of Russell's death. He was a well-known and liked man who communicated easily with all in the race walking fraternity.

His race walking career, like many of us, began at school. To those walkers active in the 1970's and 1980's Russell would have been well known. His Club in those days was Highgate Harriers. He was a reliable club member and was an accomplished racer achieving the 7 mile in the hour standard on a number of occasions. His ambition was to become a Centurion and indeed on a number of occasions Russell did attempt the 100 mile distance. Sadly, due to lack of time for appropriate conditioning he was not successful. This, however, remained a goal that Russell hoped to achieve when retired.

His race walking career took a backseat when he graduated in Law and started to build a business specialising in Conveyancing.

I first met Russell in2012 when he joined Hillingdon AC, his local club, to restart his race walking career. He joined the club at a time when Hillingdon AC race walking section was beginning to enjoy team success. His contribution to the team ensured success for Hillingdon in the Enfield League when finishing in the frame in 2012, 2013 and 2014.

A lasting memory for me will be his competiveness and gritty determination to finish. This determination can be best exemplified by his performance in the BMAF 30k at Coventry in 2014. On an extremely hot and sultry day, conditions not best suited to Russell, he soldiered on to the finish to earn himself a Bronze medal.

His death is a sad loss for our sport in general but for Hillingdon AC in particular.

Russell is survived by Jackie his wife, Anna his daughter and Jonny his son and I'm sure that everyone connected with the ERWL extend condolence's to them.

**The League Tables** after one fixture show that Ilford AC occupy 1<sup>st</sup> (337pts) and 3<sup>rd</sup> (244) team positions, split by EHAC (286) and not far behind Belgrave H (234). Making up the top six are Surrey WC (164) and Loughton AC (159). The individual table is as the finishing order in the opening fixture.

Under 23 Cambridge Harrier Luc Legon won the **indoor 3km Winter Challenge** at LVAC on the same day as the opening League race. The winning time was 13.02 with Francisco Reis (TV/L) clocking 14.08 in second place. Twelve walkers contested the senior race and encouragingly eight of them were juniors.

**Steyning Open 15km** – Nine walkers braved the dour conditions at Steyning on 27<sup>th</sup> January. Light rain at the start turning heavier with lying water to contend with as well as a southerly wind getting up for the return, on this out and back course, which slowed the return times of everyone except Ed Shillabeer, who was two seconds faster, and therefore took the Spot Prize for the closest even split.

The men's race was easily won by Ian Richards 77.14. Trevor Jones (Steyning/L) was  $3^{rd}$  95.47, Peter Hannell (SWC/L)  $6^{th}$  113.57 Fiona Bishop (Woking/L) 103.47 won the Ladies race with Anne Jones (Steyning/L) 105.01 chasing her all the way.

**Eastern Counties and Essex indoor 1 mile championships** were staged at LVAC on 3<sup>rd</sup> February and attracted nine starters. First to cross line was George Wilkinson u17 (EHAC/L) 8.24.14, ahead of Stuart Bennett (Ilford AC/L) and the 2017 winner Adam Hills (Bedford AC) 9.04.69. Melanie Peddle (Loughton/L) 9.05.54, Pamela Abbott (EHAC/L) 11.09.71, Dave Ainsworth (Ilford AC/L) 11.56.24 Sebastian Alexander u11 (Havering AC) (pictured with Ron Wallwork) 12.29.37.





Conditions were cold with a stiffish wind for the **London Walks** (start pictured by Mark Easton) promoted by Loughton AC Donkey Lane, Enfield on 4<sup>th</sup> February.

In the women's 5km an unfit Neringe Aidietyte (Ilford AC) 25.28 romped home a clear winner as did u20 Chris Snook (AFD) 47.14 in the men's 10km. Melanie Peddle (Loughton AC/L) was 6<sup>th</sup> 29.37 catching Helen Middleton 29.47 in the last half mile as they finished 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Southern championship.

Maureen Noel (Belgrave/L) 31.27 was 9<sup>th</sup> and Fiona Bishop (Woking AC/L) 33.00 was 12<sup>th</sup>. In the men's race

Graham Chapman (Headington RR/L) clocked 56.47, John Hall (Belgrave/L) 61.20 was 1<sup>st</sup> Vet, Stuart Bennett (Ilford AC/L) 64.22 was 1<sup>st</sup> Centurion, John Borgars (Loughton AC/L) was timed in at 67.21, Shaun Lightman (Surrey WC/L) 69.11, Arthur Thomson 72.20 and Chris Flint (Surrey WC/L) 72.30

Peter Cassidy expressed Loughton AC's grateful thanks to the Officials, supporters and the 40 or so athletes who braved the conditions and to ensure a successful event and Enfield Town F.C. and Enfield Ignatians R.F.C. for the use of their premises.

Dave Hoben (Surrey WC/L) 72.31 turned out in the **LWC's Sam Shoebottom 10km** on 10<sup>th</sup> February. The race was won by multi-Centurion Martin Fisher in 57.35, who was followed home by Tony Bell (Lancs WC/L) 64.50 and Glyn Jones (Coventry Godiva) 65.16.
