## 2023 Enfield Race Walking League Opening Fixtures

Concern from some walkers has been expressed about the League's adoption of the A rule. The B rule which doesn't exist in any other country was introduced by the RWA in 1996 for a transitionary period to allow time for the walkers to adjust to the then new IAAF Definition.

The ERWL is proud of its "welcome to all regardless of age or standard" record and this policy will continue!

Races will be judged under both rules with the opportunity for walkers to select under which category they wish to be judged. The camaraderie, physical effort, keen rivalry and a distance and time recorded, which have been features of the League shouldn't be affected. The production of two results will be the only change.

Over recent months the system has been trialling and the judges are to be thanked for co-operating because it makes their task more complicated. Interestingly, the outcome has been that of the 20 or so regulars only four have major technique problems. They are aware of this and it doesn't seem to dull their enthusiasm or eagerness to turn up and race. So don't let the changes put vou off
