An excellent showing by Hillingdon walkers enabled their team to leap-frog Surrey WC in the *League* team table, but only by two points.

Congratulations to handicapper Jon May for providing the ingredients for so many tight finishes; none more so than Helen Middleton's fiery attempt to stave off Callum Wilkinson's finishing burst. Her effort secured the leading lady spot on the day and stretched her *League* lead, with two races to go, to what would seem an unasailable 64 points. The men's section remains close with third and fourth placers holding a race advantage over the top two, Fransisco Reis and the much improved Malc Martin.

Results Round-up

BA & RWA 50km Championships – 4th October

I was unable to get to Hillingdon for the dual national 50km championships; BA under the international rule and the RWA version under the domestic rule. This forward looking initiative attracted thirty starters, the best for some years and it seemed to go off quite well.

Spaniards occupied the top three places in the BA category, the winner Mikel Odriozola Dominquez clocking 3.59.02, but the BA title went to Dominic King who finished fourth in a time of 4.12.41 and sadly no other British walker finished.

Jonathon Hobbs was the winner of the RWA title in 5.12.24 well ahead of Mark Cushaw 5.50.43 who was closely followed by Lancashire's David Crompton 5.51.18. Lancashire WC won the team championship with Crompton and Greg Smith 6.00.26 the only club with two walkers of the six that finished.

Maureen Noel added a seventh RWA 50km title in nine years, recording 6.01.35 not that far ahead of Sarah Lightman 6.03.23.

There was supporting 10km and 20km races both won by *Leaguers*. Fransisco Reis covered his 10km in 51.11 ahead of LucLagon 51.39, whilst Malc Martin who had not beaten two hours for 20km prior to the race smashed through the barrier clocking 1.56.40.

The first race of the 2014/15 **Cambridge Harriers league** on 18th October at Bexley had to be cancelled at the eleventh hour because of major road and pavement works. The rules provide for this eventuality and the series will now be scored on a best two from three race format.

The **Steyning AC Open 10km** on 25th October attracted seventeen competitors, among them Sean Pender who finished ninth in 64.17. The home club provided three of the first four to finish: Ian Richrds 51.03, Trevor Jones 53.05 and Jim Ball 53.38. Ilford invader Peter Ryan with 53.30 foiled a clean-sweep. In fifth place Penelope Cummings got close to the hour with 60.23, followed by Mark Culshaw 61.12, Dan Maskell 62.33, Shaun Lightman 63.07 and Sean Pender. *Leaguers* Michael Harran 65.27, Fiona Bishop 70.28 and David Hoben 70.33 also took part.

Judging of this Event – please read carefully:

The 20km races will be judged according to A rules i.e. full IAAF requirements. The Enfield League 10km will be judged according to the domestic B standard. In practice, as all walkers are automatically entered into the Enfield League event, during the first 10km only those walkers receiving 3 infractions (cards) for contact will be disqualified from the races. After 10km all infractions, including any for bent knees incurred during the first 10km, will count towards the total of 3 when a disqualification will be made.
