The 'Johnny Johnson' 5 miles on 17th September the venue QEII, Donkey Lane and the start time 11.00am times also recorded for 1, 2, 3, 4 miles

Enfield AC's Johnny Johnson was a top walker in the 1930's and he had the misfortune to be competing at the same time as the legendary "Stiker" Hyde. Johnny won the AAA's seven miles championships in 1933 and 1934 in 53.01 and 52.10 respectively as well as the 1934 Club's Open 7 in 52.45.

Johnny competed far afield and for a long time and after the war he was runner-up in the 1948 Liverpool Open 10 miles clocking 80.43

The Ken Munro Hundred – Middlesbrough, 20th/21st August

Congratulations to Jonathan Hobbs on his 100 mile victory in 18.44.32, the guickest winning time since IoM's Richard Gerrard's 18.29.40 at Douglass, IoM, in 2013. Conditions were horrendous with periods of persistent heavy rain and high winds making Jonathan's performance even more outstanding.

Leaguer interest centred around Helen Middleton making her first attempt to gualify as a Centurion. John Borgars who six years ago at Redcar at the age of 70 became the oldest walker to gualify, Chris Flint with over 20 completions to his credit and Kevin Marshall who gualified at Colchester in 2004 and like Chris is an international at this distance. None of them were able to complete the distance. Nevertheless, as their performances show, they deserve much credit. Chris was on the road for 9.14.36 for 34¹/₂ miles. John 10.19.09 for 47+ miles. Helen 14.42.47 for 66 miles and Kevin 19.29.90 for 83 miles

Helen kindly responded to a request for her thoughts on her experience.

Lessons learnt:

Just because the weather had been settled and dry for weeks in Bedfordshire, don't assume that will be the case for the race- take lots of spare clothes and socks and shoes even if it feels over the top

Be sure to get the nutrition right - plan the eating and drinking and stick to the plan

Don't rely on an Apple Watch to clock up the miles

Don't worry about the support crew. Use the hour before the race focusing on self and not the team. They knew exactly what they were doing and had 24 hours to sort it. They didn't need me fussing.

1am onwards is grim - even if it has stopped pouring.

As I was told I would - I do regret throwing in the towel at 64.8 miles but at the time my wet left foot had started to scream, I was leaning to the left and what with an upset tummy, tail end of a migraine and no appetite but knowing that I should eat - my head made its mind up.

But what an amazing experience. The organisers, officials and all supporters were incredible. At least walkers were moving - officials and supporters stood in the wind and then rain for hours. Often the officials were deployed to the extreme parts of the course where they were by themselves- can't have been fun. The supporters continued to cheer, offer support and encouragement.

Do I feel like I achieved anything? - no - it does feel like a failure even though my previous longest walk was 20k - or is a half marathon longer?



Would I do it again: Oh Yes - there's something very special (if a bit bonkers) about this event.

Surrey Walking Club 3km Championships, Tonbridge Track on 17/8/22

Tonbridge's Guy Thomas won the race in a guick 12.27. Leaguers Dave and Stephen Crane 14.25 and 14.32 occupied the minor placings with Geraldine Legon 22.05, Chris Flint © 22.42 and Peter Hannell 23.18 among the 15 competitors.

Jacqueline Benson competing in the South Yorkshire League 5km set a pb of 28.25 after a close handicap finish with Lancashire Leaguer Tony Bell whose actual time was 32.19.

There were good turnouts for the two track races promoted on Bank Holiday Monday 29th August.

In the morning at the Southend City Mile Daniel King © lapped 16 other competitors to stop the clock at 7.01.4. Setting a track record of 8.47.7 Emma Dyos was third overall and first woman, whilst Colin Harle 3rd/9.15.4 and John Arthur 4th/9.17.0 reversed their positions of the previous day at the StoneX stadium. Leaguers in the field were Rachell Lawless 5th/9.32.6, John Borgars © 7th/10.15 Lesley Morris 8th/10.18.08, Steve Allen © 11th/10.27, Alan O'Rawe © 14th/12.01.9 and Dave Ainsworth © 15th/13.29.4. John Borgars © and Shaheda Arthur 17th/16.15.8 had also competed at the StoneX stadium the previous day.

In the afternoon A field of 19 contested the 3km at the Tonbridge AC 75th Anniversary Open meeting. The race brought down the curtain on Tom Bosworth's outstanding race walking career. The race took pride of place at the meeting and created a wonderful atmosphere. As to be expected Tom won in 11.41.18. Leaguers at the meeting were David Crane 14.52.77, Mel Peddle 15.59.59 and Geraldine Legon 21.46.22.

Fiona Bishop 20.31.01 finished runner-up behind Penelope Cummings 18.56.02 in the Surrey championship 3km at the David Weir stadium, Carshalton on 3rd September. Ron Penfold 21.01.03 and Chris Flint 22.47.04 also took part and all set a season's best performance.

Twenty-four walkers made up the field for the Eastern Masters Finals at Bedford on 4th September. The distance was 2km and Melanie Peddle 10.34.53 won the Women's A race and John Borgars 12.45.99 the Men's B race.

The European championships proved to be a disappointing one so far as Callum Wilkinson was concerned. He demonstrated that in terms of fitness and endurance he can hold his own in any top class field. He would be the last to make excuses, but months of missed training followed by a rehab regime following knee surgery must have had some effect.

A really Big Well Done! To the Welsh duo Bethan Davies and Heather Lewis. Bethan made history by becoming the first British woman to compete in a major Games at a distance further than 20km when finishing 11th/2.59.38 in the women's 35km. Her time was a pb and also the highest placing by a British woman in a major international championship since 2010, when Jo Atkinson nee Jackson won Gold at the Delhi Commonwealth Games and finished 10th in the European championships. Heather bounced back from a disgualification in the last European championships to finish 13th/95.36.
